


UPCOMING EVENT: HOLIDAY PARTY!

Pot-luck desserts: You are invited to bring your favorite dessert to share! Please bring a serving utensil if needed, with your name on it.

Gift Plants: SDCSS provides a free plant to all members. You will be given a ticket when you check in—save it for the drawing!

Gift Exchange (optional): You are invited to bring a plant to participate in the exchange, just put your name on the plant. **How it works:** a panel of judges will select the "Best Plant", and the owner of that plant then gets first pick of all remaining plants. The owner of the plant they select then picks, and this continues until all plants are gone. Bring only one plant per person! The "Best Plant" will be included in the Live Auction. **Silent auction:** There will be a variety of items donated, along with some amazing centerpieces, which will be auctioned off during the party. Items will have cards to enter your bids. The highest bid at the close of the auction buys the item. 




